The worst experience i could have ever imagined. I paid top's for a penthouse at 200 w 58th. Had nothing but troubles...no water at all so construction to fix that which lasted a menth and it was major construction...they would not put me in a hotel or give me any compensation. Then i had a ruptured pipe resulting its another month of major construction. Same thing. Nothing for my troublest Stay away from these money hurspry wealthy landlords. One of the biggest in NYC. This is the worst nightmare of renters in NYC. The management was notified of mice infestation in July and the unit was found of health code violations for mice infestation. But I still see mice droppings.

In addition, the exterminator casually leaves poison powder out in open air. And the management sends the exterminator without the renter's consent, even after I told them about the negligent poison treatment and not to send the exterminator.

The management also gives your personal contact information out to vendors without your permission. This company operates as if it is above the law.

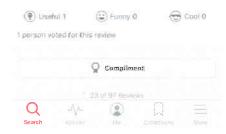
Even after you go through the immense amount of frustration and paperwork in the application noncess dealing with this real estate giant gets





Do not rent from this management company. My roommates and I have been experiencing verminissues since July, and management has been completely unresponsive. We asked for them to switch us to a different unit with the same configuration, since these issues likely stem from a hole somewhere in our apartment that we can't find. They said they would, but they would raise our rent 500 dollars a month. They proceeded to tell us that "These things happen. This is New York City." They have been incredibly insensitive and unresponsive. Do not rent from this management company. I am reporting them to the Department of Bulldings.

Since signing the lease, they've been rude, impossible to get ahold of, and just overall apathetic.

When my lease ended, I thought I could just pay for another month while I moved out, but suddenly I receive this invoice for 170% of what my already overpriced rent was with absolutely no explanation. Then I had to educate myself and discovered what a "hold over rate" is. They sent no explanation what so ever. And I combed through my lease agreement and it's not mentioned anywhere. Horrible experience. Decided to move out my stuff into storage within 24 hours to avoid having to pay it.

PLEASE NOONE WORK WITH THIS COMPANY. TERRIBLE SERVICE AND RIP OFF REPORT.



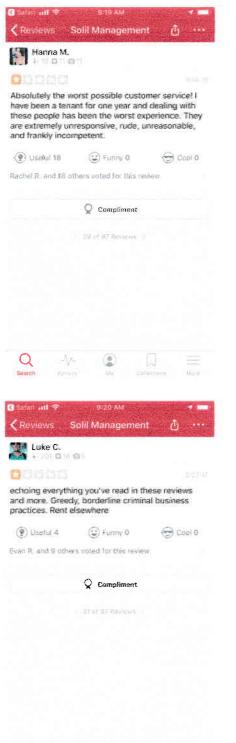

We were excited because the rent was the average for the neighborhood but we didn't have to pay a brokers fee. Soon after moving in, we began to despise Sofil. They are the scum of the earth. I was told by many friends who have lived with Sofil or are in the real estate industry to not pay your last months rent be you are never getting a security deposit back... and in the small chance that you do get it back, it will be after a year of pestering them asking when you are going to get it back. The best part of it all is that no one can do anything about it since they own a ton of real estate in the city.

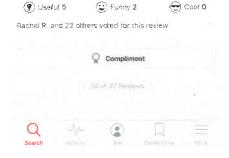
All these negative reviews about them are not a joke. But it won't matter for most people reading this since most people who are will have to rent from them.

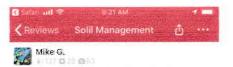

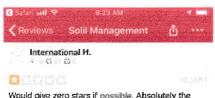

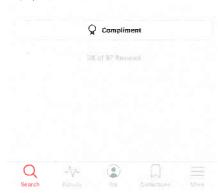

Just to reiterate all of the posts previous to mine, this is by far the WORST experience. If ye ever had working with ANYONE on a professional level, it is beyond words how the old woman at the front desk has had her job for this long, I've never met someone so outwardly abusive and rude in my life. If I ever had to beat an old woman up I would certainly choose her. And don't get me wrong, if you're able to get past this horrible woman after hours of arguing you will be passed to a slightly younger but equally as crotchety staff member.

Much like any building management company in NY the demand is so high for these apartments that if you don't want to take it someoine else behind you will certainly grab it. This mentality has shaped and shifted building managers across the city turning it from a "service" industry into an industry where professional courtesy and business etiquette go out the window.

I would like to tell you to look else where but I have a feeling it's just as bad, iff you do however decide to go with them I suggest you come in fired up and guns blazing. If you go into that building with a smile on your face or with a positive attitude they

thave been living in one of Sofil Managements" buildings for almost 20 years. Each year it gets worse and worse. Recently there was a flood caused by a neighbor on the 8th floor of my building in the Aline. This happened on May 29th, it is now July 5th and I am having an awful time having the repairs set up. My ceiling in my bathroom has fell 2 times already. The wood floors are buckling up and seems that they have not a care in the world. I have been back and forth with them for the past 6 weeks to have the repairs scheduled. Is all I am getting is a run around. Funny thing I have to pay the rent during this disaster I was told if I put it in escrow I would be charged a late fee. The noise in the building has been horrible. I work from home and the drilling is constant where I can't even hear anyone on the phone. I actually hurt myself cleaning up from the flood. I had surgery in May and needed to be resting until August. Well that does not happen here. I had to ily out of her 2 weeks ago due to the noise, dust and must and mold in my apartment. (am going to be giving them the bill for this but I am sure they won't pay for it. I just want a buy out. No one should have to live in these conditions. Thet the owner would not live the way she has her









Whether for location, building, apartment or a price, NEVER rent apartments from Solil Management. If you find out there is an issue, Solil will most certainly not help.

First of all, I want to point out one person who is outright incompetent and rude at Sofil. His name is Albert Lieu and he is Sofil's leasing manager. For the last year I've been having massive cockroach issues. They were literally flooding my apartment in August and September of 2015. An exterminator came, sprayed chemicals that not only made the cockroach issue worse (because insects started to abandon more toxic areas and started attacking places less toxic like my apartment), but it was a source of a very severe allergy on my legs. My legs were affected so much, I couldn't get rid of the allergy for about a year and when I did it was with a very strong staroid shot.

We were promised that roaches would go away and they flid sometime around winter. And we renewed the lease. Little did we know that they would come back with a double quantity again in summer, but this time also along with mice. Now cockroaches are everywhere - in my bed, in my food, I drink





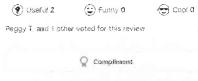
Highly dishonest management company, they accept lots applications and take the credit check fee of \$75. I used to run credit reports for real estate they cost the company \$25 max. After that they tell you someone else got the apartment, that it is going to be renovated and is not yet available to rent, or the jack up the rent in a bidding war. I tried to rent two apartments in from there building on 178 East 38th Street and this happened both times. I will be filling a case against them is small claims court if they do not give me back my credit check as well as a complaint with the city. Avoid at all costs, if they are this bad getting into the building (the sale) imagine how bad they are once you are trapped in a lease!

One more example of how they fie: I call them up and ask for my credit check fee and application back and the leasing manager (Pitar) tells me that I am calling a call center. I know she is lying and ask for her name which was a fight to get out of her. Once she tells me her name I tell her that I meet her when submitting an application to an apartment that was never available.





The most unprofessional management company in NYC. Solil is completely unresponsive and incapable. Make sure you get every agreement written in paper because they will not live up to their word. I would not choose this management company again even if it was the last one in New York. The employees and managers at Solil should be ashamed at the low quality of their work.







I have to add my experience, just in case someone thinks they will be getting a bargain by renting from Solil/Sol Goldman. It won't be worth it. Many years ago, I rented a studio apartment at 133 E. 45th Street, 4-R. Naturally, since it was "centrally located," I paid half my student income for rent. There was no kitchen--it had a hot plate, and a half-sized (ancient) refrigerator. There was no lock on the apartment door. There was no fire escape. Every holiday or long weekend, the heat and hot water went off, and after many phone calls and reports to the heat complaint line, was eventually restored...several days after the holiday. There was no super. The super worked in a building on 46th Street and avoided our building as extra, uncompensated work. The door to the building was broken off the hinges, a huge safety problem that took weeks to repair. There were mice, and several prostitutes who operated out of the 2nd floor rear apartment. (Was told this by the guys who worked in the barbershop on the second floor. Apparently, they paid the rent on time, so they were no issue to the management company.)

The loke is, the same apartment is currently listed as available online. There is now a second sink in

Solil Management and Sol Goldman Investments is by far the worst management company I have ever had to deal with. It was unbelievable to me the way the super in my building (145 E 16th Street, Apt 7B) was able to cheat people out of money on every possible occasion, and he did so with management knowing about it! They did not seem to care at all about all of the things that were going on that I bilatantly told them about. I hope every tenant that has ever lived in their buildings gives them awful reviews and they can't fill their buildings. If you have a choice NEVER choose to rent in a building managed by Solit.





This business has lied to me many times. They threatened to raise my rent 7.9% which is not the legal limit if still living in residence. When I tried to get out of the lease they refused to receive the documents I had hand delivered, emailed, faxed, etc. until I threatened to involve my attorney. They have sent numerous bills, one at ever 6k and one for over 2k stating I owe them money only to tell me later that they never actually opened my file. Again, they "found" my info when I threatened using my attorney. They never emailed me or wrote a letter about people trying to see my unit and I had multiple people let in by their super without my notice. This is a violation of my safety and privacy. They will now not release my deposit stating I was supposed to have written them a formal notice which was never stated in any letter or email from them. This is the worst company I have ever dealt with and they try to steal money who cannot afford





one word... SLUMLORD!! 1st of all, my apartment became infested with bed bugs. In fact, the whole building had been infested for months. And no, I'm not just making up things. I have paperwork and exterminator records to back up my statements. After telling the company about the infestation, they clidn't believe me and I had to pay for my own

p.s. I only put down 1 star because the website would not allow me to keep the field blank. I really would like to put down NEGATIVE 1000.





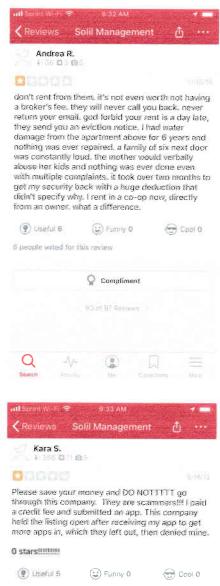

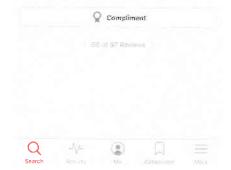

From the beginning, we were lied to about the rent, it somehow increased \$300/month from the time we submitted our paperwork to the lease signing. They tell you in absolute piece meal as to the required documentation and give you impossible deadlines "or the apartment will be sold to someone else." Literally telling us at 1pm that we need to submit notarized guarantor forms by 430pm (they like to leave early) while our guarantors have jobs and were in 2 different states. Also, we had to provide SCREENSHOTS OF OUR BANK ACCOUNTS?!? Then, dealing with a devilish and rude lady named Pilar, we were pulling our hair out every day. We were told that things would have gone smoother if we were "experienced renters" while I had already lived in 4 apartments throughout 3 boroughs prior to this disaster. All parties involved on our end were honestly appailed by how disorganized this shitshow of a company was. Finally, Solil really needs to have someone else answering the phones because the "lady" that currently does may be the nudest and most





I read all the reviews on Yelp when I decided to out a lease on a west village studio owned by Soliii. I ignored the reviews thinking somehow my situation would be different. IT WASNIT. After waiting almost 2 weeks to hear my application was excepted, I sat in the Solii office and signed three copies of my lease. I gave them my checks and Shelly Weinberg (in the office) shook my hand and told me everything was settled.

This week when I called to confirm a move-in time with the super, the super told me my name wasnit the name she was given from the landlord. I told her it was definitely a mistake. 2 hours later, I received a voicemail from Shelly saying "there is some kind of mistake...your leasing papers did not go through...the apartment was rented to someone else.

WHAT? After a back and forth with my broker, I find out that someone who had originally been approved for the apartment and backed out decided that they wanted the apartment AFTER I had signed the lease! So they gave that apartment to that person. Not only is that probably a lie and I assume they got a higher offer than mine (which was full asking) but











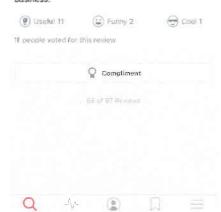

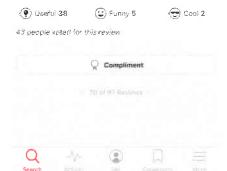

Very shady business practices here, stay AWAY!





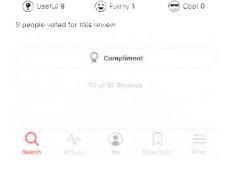
During the year that I lived in an apartment managed by this inept company we failed to receive monthly invoices prior to the first of each month. the complex was found to be in violation of the fire code, no formal communication provided around renewal or vacancies, and over six unreceived notices through fax, phone, email, email again, and manned fax of new address. You WILL get scammed. Read this before thinking about working with them.

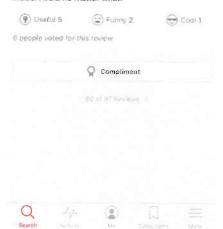
Here's how it goes:

They have tons of buildings in great locations all over Manhattan (at least). They advertise an apartment that is available for what seems like a fantastic price. All of their listings are always below market. You think you've finally found it: the perfect apartment that you've been looking for, for the price you want. You jump on it. You pay hundreds of dollars in application fees. They accept your application, and you wait, and wait. AND WAIT. Because they we been accepting applications for this apartment for weeks. Maybe even months, There's no guarantee that that apartment was even AVAILABLE when you applied for it. They collect hundreds and hundreds of applications (and the \$100 per person along with each application) and never intend to look at them. Finally, someone puts in an application with a proposed monthly rent that's much higher than that very fair price you were originally attracted to. It was listed as \$3000? Put in \$3600. Listed at \$5500? Put in \$5900,





Avoid at all costs. I literally had to take the, to court so repairs to make my apt safe and livable would be made. Avoid no matter what.





You get what you pay for. These guys own most of the rent controlled buildings in the city, so besically they have very little incentive to keep their residents happy.

Repairs are very, very hard to get as the super is often over-loaded and forgetful. This is worse than it sounds, given that our building was 100 years old.

Problems we had with our apartment include: a refrigerator that was broken from the time we moved in until they finally admitted it was broken and replaced it about 8 months later. A shower that was leaking a waterfall into the floor below us, almost fell through the floor, and despite our regular calls and emails was not fixed until the building manager came over 5 months later, saw the damage, and finally believed us. We didn't have heat or hot water for almost a week in December, due to a "water main break" (a quick call to the city assured us there was no such break, so god knows...). The building is "visited" by exterminators every month, but we've never seen them, and have mice and roaches all over the place despite our cleanliness and constant complaints to both the company supposedly doing the exterminating and the management. Recently, some mice or rats died











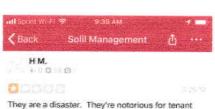

It took one month of them not calling me back to update me on the status of my application for them to finally approve me. During that time, every single person I spoke with was rude and unresponsive. I was hung up on about 10 times. And each time I spoke to them, I felt like I was talking to someone at a funeral - they are miserable people. After some issue with the bank checks and my lease (a minor issue that could've been worked out in a professional manner), a woman named SHELLY (apparently the director of leasing) screamed and yelled at me over the phone telling me! have been "making things up" and "calling too much" (I only call too much because I got hung up on every day), She then proceeded to scream at my mother without giving her a chance to speak. This woman is classless and vulgar, unprofessional and is unfit for a job that requires her to interact with humans. Solil Management should be embarrassed that this woman is representing their name.





They are a disaster. They're notorious for tenant harassment (sending process servers to serve collection notices for rent that they ALREADY HAVE). Never return phone calls. Never fix anything. Leaks, water damage, mold....but what do you expect from people that sued their own mather??

There was racoon in the laundry room twice and no one did anything about it. Our neighbor upstairs flooded our apartment as the plubming is so bad and again, no call back.

Also no one I've spoken to has ever received their security deposit back.

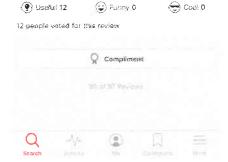
